What is this product?

Type

The product is a unit of the sub-fund TATA India Equity Fund (the sub-fund of Multipartner SICAV (the "Umbrella Fund"), a "société d'investissement à capital variable" (SICAV) and is authorised as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS) in accordance with Part I of the Law of 17 December 2010 on undertakings for collective investment (the "Law of 2010").

Term

The Fund has no maturity date. The Fund could be closed under the conditions set down in the current prospectus of the Fund.

Objectives

Investment Objective

The sub-fund invests in the following instruments:

- direct investments in equities and other shares of companies listed on an exchange in India; up to 100% of the sub-fund's assets.
- ADRs (American depositary receipts) and GDRs (global depositary receipts) of companies located in India. ADRs and GDRs must comply with the provisions in Article 41 of the Law of 2010 and must not contain any embedded derivatives. The sub-fund may use derivative financial instruments (derivatives) solely for currency hedging purposes. The range of possible instruments also includes currency forward contracts.

Investment Policy

Investments in India may be made through the acquisition of equities listed on an exchange in India or of equity-based products, in particular ADRs (American depositary receipts), GDRs (global depositary receipts), P-notes (participatory notes), exchange-traded funds (ETFs) and other investment funds that meet the criteria of eligible assets pursuant to Article 44 of the Law of 2010. P-notes are instruments that are issued by financial institutions and offer exposure to the underlying securities. These are eligible as investments for the sub-fund, provided they meet all legal and contractual criteria. Depending on the nature of the investment, P-notes are classified as either certificates or warrants/options.

The Fund is actively managed with reference to the MSCI India Index (the "benchmark") by virtue of the fact that it uses the latter in the appropriate currency for performance comparison purposes. However, the benchmark is not used to determine the Fund's portfolio composition or as a performance target, and the Fund can only be invested in securities that are not represented in the benchmark.

The sub-fund may use derivative financial instruments (derivatives) solely for currency hedging purposes.

The sub-fund's assets are mainly invested directly in shares.

Share Class Policy:

Any income arising from this Share Class will be accumulated. Other share classes of the Fund may distribute income.

The Fund has several share classes. These may differ with regard to fees, minimum investment, use of revenues and investor qualification.

Processing of subscription and redemption orders

Investors may buy or sell the Fund on any bank working day in Luxembourg.

Intended retail Investor

This Fund is aimed at retail and professional clients and eligible counterparties, who are seeking capital accumulation across categories and have a long-term investment horizon. This Fund is aimed at investors with basic knowledge or experience of financial products. The investor is prepared to bear financial losses and does not require any capital guarantees.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 7 years.

The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

We have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact our capacity to pay you.

Performance Scenarios

What happens if Carne Global Fund Managers (Luxembourg) S.A. is unable to pay out?

Costs over Time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0 % annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario
